



ABOUT THE DATA

This publication provides a data source for Alberta's international trade, and is intended to provide businesses with information on current export markets.

A profile is included for each country that imported over \$10 million worth of Alberta's goods in 2005. Each profile lists the top commodities Alberta exported to that country and compares these to Canadian exports. A summary of export totals to all countries is included in Appendix B.

The trade good nomenclature used is the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (Harmonized System or HS), adopted by Statistics Canada in 1988.

Exports by geographic region, industry, and commodity are also provided in the following sections. Industry Canada's regional groups are used. Industry groupings are based on Statistics Canada's concordance table between export commodity and industry classifications.

For the purposes of this publication, six-digit HS codes are presented in the country profile tables. For simplicity, some commodity descriptions accompanying these codes have been revised from their standard format. Readers requiring the exact content of a particular HS number are referred to the Customs Tariff Schedule of Canada.

Statistics Canada is the main source of information for the publication. Estimates for commercial and transportation service exports are developed by Alberta Economic Development and are based on special surveys conducted by Statistics Canada. The informational captions appearing at the top right corner of each country profile are from *World Factbook 2006*. The term GDP at PPP in the captions refers to Gross Domestic Product at Purchasing Power Parity, and "nes" in the country profiles refers to "not elsewhere specified."

The term "exports" refers to "domestic exports," goods grown, extracted or manufactured in Canada. The term includes goods of foreign origin, which have been materially transformed in Canada and then re-exported.

Unfortunately, service exports cannot be included on a country specific basis since these data are not presently available. However, these exports, including travel and tourism, have been provided in the "Year in Review" section. Throughout the remainder of this document, "exports" will refer strictly to merchandise exports.



THE YEAR IN REVIEW


Alberta's international exports rise 16.7% in 2005 In 2005, Alberta exported \$86.9 billion worth of goods and services to 191 countries, an increase of 16.7% from 2004's total of \$74.4 billion. This total was comprised of \$79.2 billion in commodity exports and \$7.7 billion in service exports. Canadian exports of goods and services increased 5.2% in 2005.

Goods Exports Exports of commodities increased by 18.5% from \$66.8 billion in 2004 to \$79.2 billion in 2005. Alberta's largest export markets were the U.S., China and Japan. The U.S. imported \$71.5 billion worth of goods, China \$1.9 billion and Japan \$1.2 billion.




Note: World GDP grow th rates are based on exchange rates at Purchasing Pow er Parity. Source: International Monetary Fund

Alberta's export boom was driven mainly by the energy sector as oil and natural gas prices reached historic highs in 2005. The combined effects of hurricanes Katrina and Rita, political uncertainty in key oil-producing countries, and the global economic boom resulted in higher energy prices. While 90.9% of the 2005 gain in goods exports was accounted for by the energy sector, the

manufacturing sector also showed healthy growth, contributing a gain of \$1.2 billion. Exports of chemicals, petroleum and coal products, and oil and gas field machinery were the prime contributors to manufacturing export growth in 2005.
The economic regions around the globe continued to expand in 2005, albeit at a decelerated rate. The global economy expanded by 4.9% in 2005, and while this was lower than the 5.5% posted in 2004, the growth was above the 20-year average of 3.6%. The U.S. economy grew by 3.5% and Europe, by 1.7%. Asia (excluding Japan) expanded by 8.2% in 2005 according to the International Monetary Fund (IMF). World trade in goods and services remained strong in 2005, with world trade volumes growing by 7.3%. a rate higher than the 20-year average of 6.3%.
The key regional markets for Alberta were North America, Asia and Europe. North America (mostly the U.S. and Mexico) accounted for 90.8% of total commodity exports, Asia for 5.7% and Europe for 1.6%. Exports to most regions were higher in 2005 than in 2004. Exports to North America increased by 20.4% to \$72.0 billion, to Asia by 1.4% to \$4.5 billion, and to the Middle East and North Africa by 11.3% to \$491 million. Europe and South America were the only regional markets that posted declines in export demand. The region with the fastest growth was the Commonwealth of Independent States: exports to that region rose 23.9% to \$176 million.
Commodity exports can be classified into three sectors: mining and energy, primary agriculture, and manufacturing. The mining and energy sector accounted for the majority of exports at \$57.0 billion, followed by the manufacturing sector at \$19.5 billion and primary agriculture at \$2.0 billion. From 2004 to 2005, exports in the mining and energy and manufacturing sectors increased by 24.6% and 6.5%, respectively, while primary agriculture exports declined by 1.8%.
Service exports of \$7.7 billion were recorded in 2005 comprised of \$1.6 billion in international travel and tourism receipts, \$2.6 billion in exports of transportation services and \$3.5 billion in commercial services. Service exports were up 0.9% in 2005 but lower than the 2.5% gain in 2004 as a result of the strong dollar and continued weakness in commercial services exports.
Unlike commodity exports, services cannot be included on a country specific basis. Therefore, unless otherwise specified, the term "export" in the remainder of this publication will refer strictly to commodities.
 Some of the factors that influenced Alberta's 2005 trade include: high natural gas and crude oil prices; continued strength in the world economy and in world trade volumes; strong Canadian and EURO currencies and continued U.S. dollar weakness; booming U.S. and Chinese economies and strengthening Japanese economy; low world prices for grains and oil seeds; re-opening of U.S. border to live cattle under 30 months of age; and oil sands production problems.

ALBERTA EXPORTS BY INDUSTRY

High energy prices boost Alberta exports The value of Alberta's goods exports reached a historic high of \$79.2 billion in 2005, an increase of 18.5% from 2004. Increased crude oil and natural gas prices were the primary drivers of the export boom as energy exports accounted for 90.9% of the \$12.4 billion gain in Alberta goods exports. The continued strength in global demand, especially from the U.S. and China, also contributed to the healthy growth of exports in the non-energy sector. Exports of *machinery and equipment* and *chemicals*, among others, posted strong gains in 2005.



The mining sector accounted for \$57.0 billion (71.9%) of Alberta's goods exports. This consisted primarily of *gas and natural gas liquids* and *crude petroleum* at \$31.7 billion and \$24.6 billion, respectively. Mining and energy exports were 24.6% higher than in 2004, mainly a result of higher prices for crude oil and natural gas.

The manufacturing sector contributed \$19.5 billion in exports, an increase of 6.5% from 2004. A robust world economy and healthy global trade volumes pushed volumes and prices up for many manufactured products. Price and volume increases contributed equally to the increase in the value of manufacturing exports. Exports of *chemicals* were up by \$1.1 billion (21.0%), of *petroleum and coal products* by \$202 million (27.5%), of *machinery* by \$199 (14.1%) million and of *transportation equipment* by \$94 million (22.6%). Exports of *computer and electronic products* fell for a fifth consecutive year.

Primary agricultural exports totalled \$2.0 billion in 2005, a decline of 1.8% from 2004. The re-opening of the U.S. border to live cattle exports under 30 months of age resulted in a \$276 million increase in *livestock* export receipts. The gain, however, was not enough to offset the decline in *crops* exports which fell by \$312 million, a result of lower prices for wheat, barley, and canola.

Agriculture, Food and Beverages

Weak prices cause agricultural exports to decline Exports of primary agriculture products and food and beverages (agri-foods) were valued at \$4.9 billion in 2005, a decline of 2.0% from the prior year's \$5.1 billion. Exports of most crops declined in value with wheat (including durum wheat) and peas and beans posting the biggest decreases. Beef exports declined 6.9%, driven by a 5.4% decline in prices and a 1.6% volume decline partly caused by a three-week labour strike at a major packing company in late October and early November of 2005. The re-opening of the U.S border to live cattle led to an increase of \$273 million in live cattle exports, but the gain was not enough to offset the contraction in other agricultural product exports.

Exports of wheat (including durum wheat) fell 24.6% to \$786 million, a combined result of weak prices and lower volumes. Wheat prices declined by 15.8%. This was compounded by a 10.5% fall in volume demand from major importing countries such as China (down \$139 million), the Philippines (down \$28 million), and Algeria (down \$25 million).

Exports of pork products increased by \$107 million, driven mainly by strong volume demand from Japan (up \$48 million) and the U.S. (up \$23 million). Oil seeds exports posted a \$41 million decline mainly on account of a 17.7% price decrease. Vegetable oils and fats (consisting of canola oil and cake) declined by \$108 million as prices declined by 20.4% and volume contracted by 14.9%. Exports of frozen foods (mainly potatoes), fell \$20 million due to weak volume demand from the U.S. (down \$26 million) and Japan (down \$3 million).

The U.S. accounted for 48.9% of agri-food exports (\$2.4 billion), mostly in the form of beef products (\$1.2 billion), live cattle (\$273 million), canola oil-cake and meal (\$206 million), frozen potato products (\$152 million) and pork (\$128 million). Other major agri-food markets were Japan (canola and pork), Mexico (canola and beef) and China (wheat) at \$770 million, \$361 million and \$261 million, respectively.

Mining and Energy

High oil and gas prices boost mineral fuel exports In 2005, the value of mining and energy exports totalled \$57.0 billion, \$11.2 billion more than the year before. The key driver behind the 24.6% surge in mineral fuel exports was the steep rise in crude oil and natural gas prices. The strong global demand for energy, compounded by political instability in oil-producing countries and the impact of hurricanes Katrina and Rita on oil supplies led to the escalation of oil and gas prices in 2005.

Natural gas exports, which comprised 52.9% of Alberta's mining and energy exports increased by \$6.6 billion (or 28.2%) in value, driven by a 28.6% increase in natural gas prices. Crude petroleum, which accounted for 43.2% of total energy exports, posted strong growth of 20.6%, with an increase of \$4.2 billion in the value of exports. Oil sands production problems resulted in a 1.3% decline in the volume of crude oil shipments, but the 22.2% increase in prices more than offset its impact.

Liquefied petroleum gases continued its uptrend from 2004, with shipments increasing by \$119 million in 2005. The value increased by 8.4% despite a 7.2% decline in volume because prices increased by 16.8%. Sulphur exports went up 70.7% in 2005, driven mainly by healthy growth in demand. Volumes increased by 94.9%, offsetting the 12.4% decline in prices. China remained Alberta's largest sulphur market, as its imports more than doubled from \$123 million to \$277 million. Other large markets were the U.S. (\$40 million), Australia (\$30 million) and Cuba (\$21 million).

In 2005, coal exports rose by 54.0% because of price and volume increases. Prices increased by 36.6% and volumes by 12.7%. The major coal market was the U.S. (\$81 million), followed by Japan (\$75 million) and South Korea (\$34 million).

Alberta's Major Mining and Energy Exports

The majority of Alberta's mining exports went to the U.S., consisting mostly of crude petroleum, natural gas and propane. More than 99% was imported by the U.S., while the rest was imported primarily by China, Japan, South Korea and Australia.

Manufacturing

Manufacturing export volumes register gains despite strong Canadian dollar Alberta's manufacturing sector exports performed better than expected in 2005 despite the appreciation of the Canadian dollar, posting an increase of \$1.2 billion, partly because of soaring energy prices. Global economic growth remained strong in 2005 resulting in increased demand for such exports as synthetic resins, fertilizers, refined petroleum products, and gas and oil field equipment. These four products combined gained \$1.2 billion in export value. The gains in these products, however, were partially offset by price and volume-driven declines in exports of oriented strand board (OSB), boneless beef (fresh or chilled), and lumber. Export volumes grew an estimated 3.3% in 2005.

The manufacturing sector accounted for one-quarter of all commodity exports in 2005, down from its 27.4% share in 2004. Of the 15 industries that comprise this sector, nine increased their export values compared to 2004. The industries with the largest gains were *chemicals* (up by \$1.1 billion or 21.0%), *refined petroleum and coal products* (up by \$202 million or 27.5%), *machinery* (up by \$199 million or 14.1%), *transportation equipment* (up by \$94 million or 22.6%) and *primary metals* (up \$90 million or 9.0%). Exports of *computer and electronic products*, mostly telecom equipment, continued its decline that started in 2001, falling 11.7% in 2005.

The *chemical* industry remained Alberta's largest manufacturing sub-sector with exports of \$6.6 billion, followed by *food, feed and beverages* with \$3.0 billion. The other sub-sectors with exports in excess of \$1 billion were *wood products* (\$1.7 billion), *machinery* (\$1.6 billion), *paper products and wood pulp* (\$1.4 billion), *computer and electronic products* (\$1.2 billion), and *primary metal products* (\$1.1 billion).

Alberta's Manufacturing Exports by Industry

Alberta's major manufactured commodity exports posted a net increase from 2004 to 2005, but sector performance varied across the major commodity groups.

The major commodity groups with the biggest gains were:

- synthetic resins (up \$594 million due to higher prices);
- fertilizers (up \$220 million arising from higher prices for urea and anhydrous ammonia prices);
- refined petroleum products (up \$199 million because of a 27.5% increase in prices and a 3.0% rise in volumes);
- oil and gas field machinery (up \$197 million due to increased volumes); and
- petro-chemicals (up \$161 million due to both price and volume increases).

The top manufacturing exports in 2005, with exports of at least \$1 billion each, were synthetic resins (such as polyethylene), organic chemicals (such as ethylene glycol), beef products and wood pulp. Collectively, these accounted for 36.6% of all manufacturing exports.

The manufactured commodities with the strongest growth in 2005 compared to the previous year were:

- polyethylene (up \$288 million, or 33.0%);
- ethylene polymers (up \$262 million, or 21.2%);
- petroleum oils (e.g. diesel oil) (up \$167 million, or 41.8%);
- anhydrous ammonia (up \$108 million or 43.4%); and
- line pipe for oil and gas (up \$124 million from \$0.34 million in 2004).

The U.S. was the destination of 92.0% of polyethylene exports, 84.1% of ethylene polymers exports, and 88.4% of petroleum oils exports. The U.S. was the sole destination of shipments of anhydrous ammonia and of line pipe.

The U.S. was also the main destination of overall manufacturing exports, accounting for 70.8% of shipments. A total of \$13.8 billion of manufactured commodities was imported by the U.S. in 2005, an increase of \$1.2 billion or 9.5% from 2004. The increase was a combined result of price-driven and volume-driven export gains in *chemicals* (up \$1.0 billion or 26.7%) and *petroleum and coal products* (up \$175 million or 25.4%), and volume increases in *primary metals* (up \$177 million or 104.9%) and *machinery* (up \$142 million or 17.6%). The growth was muted by declines in wood products (down \$288 million or 15.2%) as a result of weak prices and lower volumes, and in the computer and electronic products sector (down \$107 million or 11.8%) that continued to struggle in the wake of the high tech meltdown compounded by the effects of a strong Canadian dollar. The top three exports from Alberta to the U.S. were *chemicals* (\$4.9 billion), *food, feed and beverages* (\$1.9 billion), and *wood products* (\$1.6 billion).

Next to the U.S., the Asian countries of China, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, Hong Kong, and Singapore were the largest importers of manufactured products from Alberta.

- China imported \$1.4 billion worth of manufactured goods from Alberta; the 4.6% increase in exports resulted from an \$86 million rise in ethylene glycol exports and a \$17 million increase in ethylene polymer exports.
- Japan was the third biggest market of manufactured goods exports with a total value of \$772 million. Japan was the main destination for frozen pork, with the country importing 71.1% of total frozen pork shipments.
- South Korea, the fourth biggest market, imported \$415 million, comprised mainly of *paper products and wood pulp* (\$154 million), *chemicals*, mainly ethylene glycol (\$137 million), and *food, feed and beverages*, mainly frozen pork (\$73 million).
- Taiwan imported \$160 million worth of manufactured goods from Alberta, with *food, feed and beverages,* mostly hides and skins (\$61 million) and *primary metal products,* mainly nickel (\$31 million) making up the bulk of its imports.
- Hong Kong imported \$113 million worth of manufactured goods. More than half of this were exports of *food, feed and beverages* comprised mainly of boneless cuts of meat and hides and skins (\$70 million).
- Singapore imported manufactured goods valued at \$105 million, a significant portion of which was made up of *primary metal products* such as cobalt and nickel (\$ 39 million).

Overall, *chemicals*, *food*, *feed and beverages* and *paper products and wood pulp* were Alberta's top manufacturing exports to Asia.

Mexico, edged out by South Korea, became the fifth largest destination of manufacturing exports, importing a total value of \$332 million. This was \$139 lower than in 2004 because of declines in *food, feed and beverages* (down \$124 million) and *computer and electronic products* (down \$12 million).

Alberta's largest European Union markets for manufactured goods were the Netherlands (\$198 million), Belgium (\$194 million), the United Kingdom (\$172 million), Germany (\$103 million), Italy (\$100 million), and France (\$86 million). For the Netherlands, Belgium, and the United Kingdom, the biggest manufacturing import was nickel, for Germany organic chemicals, for Italy cereals, and for France machinery.

Other markets for manufactured goods were Australia (\$106 million) and Russia (\$80 million). For Australia and Russia, the biggest manufacturing import was machinery (mainly for boring and sinking). Smaller markets with significant import gains for manufactured goods included Iran, Sudan, Cuba, Algeria, and Italy. With the exception of Italy, which saw major import gains in cereals, the other countries mentioned posted significant gains in machinery imports.

Alberta's Major Manufacturing Exports

Forestry, (including Wood, Paper and Allied Products)

Forest product exports fall due to weak prices and strong dollar Forestry product exports totalled \$3.1 billion in 2005, declining 11.0% from 2004. The decline was a combined result of lower prices and lower demand for forest products. The largest contraction was posted by OSB exports which were down \$198 million as a result of a 16.3% price decline and a 5.7% fall in volume. Lumber exports exhibited a similar pattern with a 12.3% decline in prices and a 5.0% decline in volumes leading to a \$123 million fall in exports. While the appreciation of the Canadian dollar partially accounted for the lower prices which exporters of forestry products received, global trends in the forest products sector contributed to the weak global prices. Growing industry consolidation, rising global wood supply and declining "paper intensity" in global consumption were among the factors driving the weak prices of forestry products.

Alberta's Major Forestry Exports (Includes Wood, Paper and Allied Products)

The primary markets for wood pulp were the U.S. (\$568 million), Japan (\$155 million), South Korea (\$154 million) and China (\$104 million). Wood pulp exports to the U.S. increased by \$58 million (or 11.4%), but exports to key Asian markets declined significantly. China's imports declined by \$74 million (or 41.2%) with Japan and South Korea decreasing their imports by \$15 million (or 9.0%) and \$11 million (or 6.6%), respectively.

At 99.8% market share, the U.S. was practically the sole destination of Alberta OSB, with South Korea and Japan each importing 0.1% of OSB exports. OSB exports to the U.S. were \$741 million in 2005, a 20.9% decline from the prior year.

Lumber exports to the U.S. were valued at \$565 million in 2005. This comprised 92.3% of total exports. Japan was the second largest importer of lumber with \$43 million. These two markets declined by 13.9% and 40.9%, respectively, in 2005.

Major markets for forestry products were the U.S. (\$2.4 billion), Japan (\$200 million), South Korea (\$156 million), and China (\$109 million).

Chemicals

Strong global demand fuels chemical export growth Strong global demand for chemical products, led by the U.S. and China, benefited the sector as export receipts increased 21.0% to \$6.5 billion in 2005. All major commodities, except for diethylene glycol, experienced growth in 2005. Polyethylene exports showed the largest gains (up \$288 million or 33.0%), with ethylene polymers a close second (up \$262 million or 21.2%). While volumes increased, high chemical prices contributed significantly to the healthy export gains. The biggest price gains were posted by polyethylene (up 28.7%), ethylene polymers (up 24.1%), urea (up 47.5%), and anhydrous ammonia (up 36.2%). Strong volume gains were registered by saturated acyclic hydrocarbons (up 29.2%), unsaturated acyclic hydrocarbons (up 29.5%) and ethylene glycol (up \$7.4%).

Alberta's Major Chemical Exports

The U.S. was the primary destination of ethylene polymers, Alberta's largest chemical exports. The U.S. accounted for 84.1% of total shipments of \$1.5 billion, with China importing \$108 million for a 7.2% share. Ethylene polymer exports were driven mainly by price increases that averaged 24.1%, offsetting a slight volume decline of 3.0%.

China was the largest market for ethylene glycol with shipments of \$883 million and a 73.9% share in total exports. The U.S. and South Korea imported ethylene glycol valued at \$136 million and \$129 million, respectively. China's textiles and clothing industries continued to stimulate demand for ethylene glycol with volumes increasing by 13.5%. The U.S. also stepped up demand for this commodity with volume gains of 51.7%.

Polyethylene exports, 92.0% of which were destined for the U.S., advanced 33.0% to \$1.2 billion, because of higher prices (up 29.6%) and volumes (up 2.6%). Exports of styrene increased by 10.5% in 2005 to \$499 million because of higher prices. The U.S. was the sole market for Alberta styrene.

The U.S. accounted for 75.9% of total chemical exports at \$4.9 billion. Other major markets were China (\$1.1 billion), South Korea (\$137 million), Mexico (\$80 million), Germany (\$38 million) and Japan (\$37 million).

Machinery

Robust global energy sector drives machinery exports higher Machinery exports rose by 14.1% to \$1.6 billion in 2005. High oil and gas prices stimulated activity in the energy sector, causing demand for machinery to surge. The largest export gains were from exports of oil and gas field machinery (mainly boring or sinking machinery and parts thereof) which increased by \$197 million, a 62.1% gain from 2004. Engine, turbine, and power transmission equipment and pumps and compressors also showed strong growth, increasing by 21.4% and 11.1%, respectively.

The U.S. accounted for \$949 million (or 69.9%) of total machinery exports. Other major markets included Russia (\$50 million), Iran (\$43 million), Algeria (\$37 million), United Arab Emirates (\$32 million), China (\$31 million), Sudan (\$31 million), Australia (\$31 million), and Kuwait (\$31 million).

The U.S. was also the major destination of exports of oil and gas field machinery, mainly boring and sinking machinery and parts thereof, accounting for 55.0% of total shipments. In 2005, the U.S. imported \$132 million (or 86.1%) more of this type of machinery compared to 2004. Significant increases in demand were also posted by Algeria, Kuwait, and Yemen.

Computer and Electronic Products

High Tech exports continue to struggle Alberta's computer and electronic products industry (dominated by telecom equipment) continued to struggle in the global marketplace. The industry's exports totalled \$1.2 billion in 2005, 11.7% below the \$1.3 billion in 2004 and significantly lower than the \$4.5 billion posted in 2000.

Exports of telephone apparatus were the major source of the industry's decline, with shipments falling by \$126 million (or 25.3%). This was compounded by a \$117 million decline in wireless communication and radio/TV broadcast equipment exports. Gains were posted in exports of measuring and controlling instruments (up \$85 million).

Alberta's Major Computer & Electronic Product Exports

The decline in telephone apparatus was a result of a weakening of demand in major markets. The U.S., which imported 80.2% of Alberta's total telephone apparatus shipments, reduced its demand by \$62 million. Other major markets that reduced imports significantly were Singapore (down \$12 million), Mexico (down \$10 million), and Australia (down \$2 million).

The U.S., which accounted for 86.4% of wireless communication and radio/TV broadcast equipment exports, reduced its demand by 29.2% (down \$79 million). Israel, the second largest market, also imported \$5 million less in 2005.


Almost two-thirds (64.4%) of surveying instruments exports and 49.1% of gas or smoked apparatus exports went to the U.S. In 2005, the U.S. imported 68.6% more surveying instruments and 19.0% more of gas or smoked apparatus compared to 2004.

The U.S. accounted for \$804 million or 75.9% of Alberta's computer and electronic product exports. Other major destinations included the U.K. (\$40 million), China (\$31 million), and Singapore (\$26 million).

ALBERTA EXPORTS BY REGION

Alberta merchandise exports climb due to higher energy shipments to the U.S. In 2005, North America was Alberta's largest international export market and accounted for 90.8% of total shipments. Merchandise exports to North America were valued at \$72.0 billion, with 78.1% of these shipments being energy related. When oil and gas commodities (crude oil, natural gas, propane, butane and natural gas liquids) are excluded, North America's share of total exports falls to 68.5%.

Asia was Alberta's second largest regional market, capturing 5.7% of Alberta's total exports, followed by Europe (1.6%) and the Middle East and North Africa (0.6%).

Merchandise exports increased for seven of Alberta's nine trade regions, with Europe and South America registering the only declines. North American imports of Alberta goods increased by 20.4% because of higher deliveries of natural gas, crude oil, ethylene polymers, live cattle, light petroleum oil preparations (e.g. gasoline) and polyethylene. Excluding North America, exports grew by 2.5% due to increased shipments of ethylene glycol, sulphur, coal, pork, refined petroleum products (e.g. diesel fuel), hides and skins, ethylene polymers and barley.

Alberta's Exports by Region

Deliveries to Asia rose by 1.4% because of large export increases for hides and skins, coal and sulphur. Ethylene glycol remains the largest export to the region, accounting for almost one-quarter of shipments, with China being the primary market.

Sharply higher trade was noted with the U.S., South Korea, Iran, Vietnam and Germany. Exports to the U.S., Alberta's largest trading partner, grew by 21.0% or by \$12.4 billion.

North America

The surge in energy prices pushes North American exports higher Excluding the rest of Canada, North America is Alberta's largest trade region and accounts for the vast majority of all goods exported. In 2005, merchandise exports to the region rose by 20.4% from 2004, to \$72.0 billion.

The U.S. accounted for 99.3% of Alberta exports to North America, with virtually all of the remainder going to Mexico. Alberta accounted for 17.7% of Canada's total exports to the region.



In 2005, mining and energy exports rose by 24.2% to \$56.4 billion, primarily due to sharply higher energy prices. Oil and gas commodities, Alberta's top exports to the region, represented 78.1% of total shipments. The value of North American exports excluding oil and gas related commodities grew by 8.8% to \$15.7 billion.

The top non-energy exports were ethylene polymers, beef products, polyethylene, lumber and OSB. The easing of export restrictions on live cattle exports (under 30 months of age) by the U.S. provided a sales boost for North American destined primary agriculture products (up 35.9%). Virtually all live cattle exports were sent to the United States.

United States of America



Energy exports cement the U.S. as Alberta's number one trading partner


In 2005, the U.S. economy grew by a healthy 3.5% despite higher energy prices, the weaker American dollar and a growing fiscal deficit. Solid employment gains, as a result of improved corporate profitability, provided a boost to consumer spending. In addition, rapidly rising investment continued to fuel the economy.

The U.S. was Alberta's largest trading partner, accounting for 90.2% of all goods exports. In 2005, shipments to the U.S. grew strongly by 21.0% from 2004. Alberta's share of Canadian exports to the U.S. jumped from 18.1% in 2004 to 20.8% in 2005 - the second largest provincial share behind Ontario. Over the past decade, Alberta's share of Canadian exports to the U.S. has grown consistently from its 10.6% share registered in 1995.

In 2005, global uncertainty, weather problems and rising world demand pushed prices for crude oil and natural gas upward. According to the Conference Board of Canada, the value of U.S. energy imports has essentially doubled over the past two years. In 2005, Alberta natural gas and crude oil export prices were up 28.6% and 22.2%, respectively. At the same time, lower volumes of natural gas (down 0.3%) and crude oil (down 1.3%) were reported. The decrease in crude oil volumes was a result of oilsands production problems due to a fire at a major processing facility.

The mining and energy sector accounted for 79.0% of merchandise exports to the United States. Natural gas was Alberta's largest export to the U.S., representing 42.2% of shipments in 2005. According to the Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers, roughly 17% of the natural gas consumed in the U.S. comes from Canada with Alberta accounting for 85.3% of Canada's natural gas exports.

Alberta's second largest export, crude oil, represented 34.4% of total shipments. The U.S. is the world's largest oil importer and Canada is its largest source. Alberta accounted for 82.1% of Canada's oil exports.



Alberta's Exports to the U.S.

Excluding oil and gas commodities, U.S. bound exports were up 10.8% from 2004. Large increases were noted for polyethylene, ethylene polymers, live cattle, light petroleum oils, oil and gas pipeline, and ammonia.

Primary agricultural product exports jumped by 70.3% as livestock exports increased sharply by 254.0%. This advance was due to the U.S. allowing imports of Canadian live cattle (less than 30 months of age) for the first time since May 2003. As a consequence, live cattle shipments increased from nil in 2004 to \$273 million in 2005.

In 2005, manufacturing exports increased by 9.5% from 2004. The following manufacturing commodities showed the largest export growth (in dollar terms):

- polyethylene climbed by \$268 million to \$1.1 billion almost entirely due to sharply higher prices;
- polymers of ethylene increased by \$219 million to \$1.3 billion because of higher prices, despite lower volumes;
- light petroleum oils rose by \$131 million to \$196 million because of higher prices and especially volumes;
- iron or steel line pipe for oil and gas pipelines increased from less than \$184,000 to \$124 million; and
- ammonia shipments grew by \$111 million to \$356 million.

The U.S. imported \$196 million less in OSB in 2005 than they did in 2004, and lumber exports fell by \$91 million, primarily due to lower prices. The technology sector posted its fifth consecutive year of export declines, because of lower shipments of telecom parts and equipment.

Top U.S. States

California and Texas accounted for 37% of Alberta's non-energy exports to the U.S. Because energy exports, such as crude oil and natural gas, cannot be allocated to the state of final destination, they are not included in the following state export totals. The U.S. Midwest region and California are the major markets for Alberta oil and gas. For a breakdown of exports by state including energy commodities refer to Appendix D.

Excluding oil and gas commodities, California is Alberta's second largest trade area (excluding the U.S. as a whole) behind China, followed by Texas, Pennsylvania and Japan. In 2005:

- Exports to Alberta's largest U.S. market, California, fell by 2.3% to \$1.8 billion in 2005. Fresh boneless beef was the largest non-energy export to California, increasing from \$273 million in 2004 to \$278 million in 2005. Styrene was the province's next largest export, up 13.3% to \$222 million. OSB shipments declined by 19.7% to \$265 million.
- **Texas** imported \$1.6 billion worth of Alberta goods in 2005, up sharply by 22.9% from 2004. Ethylene polymers were the largest export commodity at \$145 million, down 4.2% from the previous year, followed by polyethylene (\$136 million) and unsaturated acyclic hydrocarbons (\$113 million). Oil and gas field equipment, ranging from pumps to boring machinery, remained a chief export totalling more than \$200 million.

- Exports to **Pennsylvania** climbed by 24.7% to \$1.3 billion. Chemical products represented about three-quarters of the non-energy commodities exported. Exports of ethylene polymers jumped by 31.3% to \$551 million, polyethylene rose by 16.6% to \$263 million, and butadiene and propylene grew by 35.3% to \$152 million. These three products accounted for more than two-thirds of exports.
- Illinois imports of Alberta goods were up 6.3%, reaching \$794 million. Polyethylene shipments increased by 45.2% to \$104 million. Other nonenergy imports included ethylene polymers (\$67 million), styrene (\$66 million), furniture parts (\$58 million), and beef products (\$56 million).
- **Washington** imports grew strongly by 19.5% to \$736 million. Live cattle, a product not exported in 2004, reached \$151 million in 2005. Other large exports were OSB (\$80 million), heavy petroleum oils such as diesel (\$79 million) and ammonia (\$36 million).
- Deliveries to **Colorado** surged upwards by 64.1% to \$546 million. Oil and gas pipeline (\$100 million) and live cattle (\$45 million), goods that were not exported in 2004, were the top export commodities in 2005. A large gain was also noted for boring and sinking machinery (up \$32 million).

Mexico



Mexico's economy expanded by 3.0% in 2005, down from the 4.2% growth rate recorded in 2004. According to the International Monetary Fund, this slower growth was due to weakness in the agricultural sector and the slowdown in global manufacturing in the first half of the year. The Mexican economy is particularly dependent on the U.S., which buys 90% of its exports. Over the past three years, Mexico's share of the U.S. import market has fallen.

"Mexico's new government is probusiness and investment, which should favour Alberta exports to Mexico".

David Nygaard, Alberta Mexico Office Alberta's exports to Mexico dropped by 29.1% to \$495 million in 2005. Manufacturing exports, representing approximately two-thirds of all merchandise shipments to Mexico, declined by 29.5%.

Beef shipments decreased by 42.0% to \$172 million, canola deliveries fell by 23.3% to \$106 million, and wheat sales declined by 26.3% to \$39 million. Polyethylene exports increased by 18.4% to \$46 million, and ethylene polymers deliveries rose by 74.2% to \$20 million.


Mexico's share of Alberta's exports was 0.6% in 2006. Alberta accounted for 16.0% of Canada's exports to Mexico, down from 24.3% in 2004. Mexico is Alberta's fifth largest international trade market.

Asia

China remains Alberta's second largest trade partner Asia is a large and growing market area with a population of nearly four billion people. In 2005, Asia registered strong economic growth close to 7.0%. Almost all of Asia's major economies grew strongly, led by China (up 9.9%) and India (up 8.3%). Japan had a more moderate advance of 2.6%. The 'newly industrialized economies' of South Korea, Taiwan, Hong Kong and Singapore had an average growth rate of 4.6%.

Alberta exports to Asia showed a modest rise of 1.4% to \$4.5 billion due to increased shipments of coal, sulphur, ethylene polymers, pork, and hides and skins. Ethylene glycol was the largest export to the region with sales of close to \$1.0 billion in 2005, and represented 87.6% of Alberta's total ethylene glycol exports. The next largest shipments to the region were wood pulp, wheat, sulphur and canola.

Chinese imports of Alberta goods were 5.1% higher because of elevated shipments of sulphur, ethylene glycol, and hides and skins. Japanese deliveries fell by 4.5% due to lower cobalt, lumber and canola deliveries. Shipments to South Korea (wheat and coal) and Vietnam (wheat, and hides and skins) were up sharply.

Between 2003 and 2005, exports to China have doubled. Increased deliveries have been spurred by strong economic growth that has ranged from 8% to 10% per year. Over the same period, exports to Japan (down 3.0%), Taiwan (down 30.8%) and Hong Kong (down 9.3%) declined. Shipments to Korea grew by 3.4% over the same period, and sales to Indonesia by 27.6%.

China



"China's rapidly expanding economy has created many export opportunities, especially for resource based commodities."

David Wong, Alberta China Office China continued to be one of the main drivers of global economic growth in 2005. According to the Export Development Corporation, an investment boom over the past few years due to foreign multinationals setting up production platforms to take advantage of China's large and low cost labour pool has fuelled imports of raw materials and machinery. China is a major market for resource-based commodities such as minerals, grains, paper and wood products, and chemicals.

China is one of Alberta's fastest growing markets with exports climbing by an average of 20.3% per year since 2001. In 2005, Chinese imports rose by 5.1% from 2004, to \$1.9 billion. Manufactured products (\$1.4 billion) make up the bulk of Chinese imports, with *chemicals and chemical products* comprising the largest share (76.7%). Alberta accounted for 29.0% of Canada's exports to China – the largest provincial share.

In 2005, China bought \$883 million worth of ethylene glycol, up 10.8% from 2004. Ethylene glycol is primarily used by China's textile and clothing industries and accounted for 46.1% of Alberta's export to China. Over the same period, sulphur deliveries more than doubled to \$277 million, exports of ethylene polymers grew by 18.5% to \$108 million, and artificial filament tow sales rose by 27.5% to \$79 million. Wheat sales fell by 65.2% to \$73 million.

Japan



"Japan has been emerging with increasing vigour from a 15-year slump."

Wes Sawatzky, Alberta Japan Office Japan's economy grew by 2.6% in 2005, the largest economic expansion in the past five years. Japan's economy was positively affected by increased domestic demand, rising employment, export growth, and improvement in the banking system.

Japanese imports of Alberta goods fell by 4.5% to \$1.2 billion. More than half of Japan's imports were related to agricultural commodities and processed food. In 2005, canola sales fell by 5.9% to \$204 million and forage products (hay) decreased by 12.2% to \$75 million. These losses were partially offset by gains in fresh and frozen pork, which saw deliveries increase by 23.2% to \$255 million.

Coal exports increased from \$28 million in 2004 to \$108 million in 2005. Chemical woodpulp shipments fell by 4.6% to \$146 million, cobalt deliveries dropped by 43.0% to \$68 million, and wheat sales decreased by 14.6% to \$62 million.

In 2005, Japan was Alberta's third largest trading partner and accounted for 27.7% of Asian imports from Alberta. Approximately 14.0% of Canadian exports to Japan came from Alberta. Over the past five years, Japanese exports have declined by an average of 0.7% per year.

South Korea



"Canada and Korea are negotiating a Free Trade Agreement. This offers the possibility of enhanced market access".

Don Smithson, Alberta South Korea Office Exports to South Korea, Alberta's fourth largest market, grew by 24.4% to \$535 million. Shipments of chemical wood pulp grew by 6.6% to \$147 million, ethylene glycol increased by 0.6% to \$129 million, and wheat surged upward by 188.4% to \$71 million. These three commodities accounted for almost two-thirds of total exports to South Korea. Coal shipments increased from nil in 2004 to \$34 million in 2005, and nickel deliveries advanced by 5.3% to \$28 million.

In 2005, exports of manufactured goods grew by 5.6% to \$415 million on the strength of *food, feed and beverages* (up \$40 million). Large increases were noted for pork (up \$17 million), and hides and skins deliveries (up \$25 million).

Alberta had Canada's second largest share of exports to South Korea at 19.6%, following British Columbia. Between 2001 and 2005, Alberta exports to South Korea have grown at an average annual rate of 2.5% per year.

Taiwan



"Import and export trade with China has increased, and this will remain strong for the next few years."

Li-an Chen, Alberta Taiwan Office In 2005, Taiwan's imports from Alberta fell by 13.7% to \$161 million. This was largely due to ethylene glycol shipments decreasing from \$29 million in 2004 to \$8 million in 2005. Over the same period, hides and skins sales increased by 8.0% to \$47 million, nickel deliveries remained unchanged at \$22 million, and sales of ethylene polymers increased from \$4.8 million to \$15 million.

Taiwan, a major electronics producer, used to be a large importer of telecom equipment from Alberta. In 2002 and 2003, Taiwan imported close to \$100 million in *computer and electronic products*. In 2005, *computer and electronic products* accounted for less than \$5 million in manufacturing shipments.

Taiwan was Alberta's tenth largest trading partner, down from ninth position in the previous year. Between 2000 and 2003, Taiwan was Alberta's sixth largest export market. Over the past five years, Taiwan's imports have fallen on average by 8.8% per year - the largest decrease amongst Alberta's ten largest trading partners. Alberta's share of Canadian exports to Taiwan has fallen from 24.6% in 2003 to 12.7% in 2005.

Hong Kong



"Strong economic growth is being driven by the booming Chinese economy."

Joe So, Alberta Hong Kong Office As Alberta's sixth largest market in Asia, Hong Kong imported \$115 million worth of Alberta goods in 2005, 5.1% less than in the previous year. Hong Kong accounted for 2.6% of Alberta's exports to Asia, and Alberta's share of Canadian exports to Hong Kong was 9.9%.

Hong Kong imports of Alberta beef increased from less than half a million dollars in 2004 to more than \$36 million in 2005. Ethylene glycol deliveries dropped by 61.3% to \$17 million, and hides and skins fell by 8.5% to \$28 million.

The majority of goods that Hong Kong imports from Alberta are manufactured commodities (98.4%), with *food, feed and beverages* accounting for the largest share of manufactured deliveries (61.6%) in 2005.

Europe

Belgium becomes Alberta's top European export market in 2005 In 2005, Europe's economy grew by a modest 1.7%, down from the 2.4% expansion registered in 2004. Over the same period, the European Union grew at similar rates. Europe's soft economic performance was due in part to rising oil prices, weak domestic demand, labour market rigidities and increased competition from Asia for manufacturing goods. Gross Domestic Product growth among the four largest economies was lacklustre: Germany (up 1.0%), France (up 1.2%), Italy (up 0.1%) and the United Kingdom (up 1.8%).

In 2005, European imports declined by 1.4% from 2004, to \$1.2 billion. Lower sales of wheat (including durum), nickel, cobalt and medical devices were partially offset by increased deliveries of semi-chemical woodpulp and heterocyclic compounds.

Belgium overtook the United Kingdom and the Netherlands to become Alberta's top European export market in 2005. Shipments to Belgium rose by 3.6% to reach \$214 million. Exports to the United Kingdom fell by 3.0% to \$208 million and deliveries to the Netherlands declined by 2.6% to \$208 million. Sales increased to Italy (up 11.0%), Germany (up 24.3%) and France (up 8.3%).

Since 2001, Alberta exports to Europe have climbed at an average annual rate of 4.9%. Annual export growth to Alberta's largest European trade partners reached 15.5% per year for Belgium, 4.4% per year for the United Kingdom, and 16.0% per year for the Netherlands. German export growth remained essentially unchanged, and sales to Italy declined by 0.9% per year since 2001.

Belgium, the United Kingdom and the Netherlands each accounted for about 17% of European imports from Alberta in 2005, followed by Italy at 13.6%, Germany at 9.0% and France at 7.4%. These countries represented 81.2% of sales to the region.



European Union



On May 1, 2004, the European Union's (EU) 15 member states¹ were joined by ten new members². The original 15 EU members accounted for nearly all (97.8%) of Alberta's export to the region.

The expanded EU's imports from Alberta totalled \$1.1 billion in 2005, down by 0.7%% from 2004. The EU 25 member states have an area of about 4 million km² and approximately 455 million inhabitants. The EU represents the world's largest economy and has the third largest population after China and India.

Bulgaria and Romania are scheduled to become members in 2007, provided they meet the conditions for membership and that the Treaty of Accession for the Republic of Bulgaria and Romania is ratified by parliaments of member states. Turkey, Croatia and Macedonia are official candidate countries to enter the European Union; however their potential join dates are uncertain.

United Kingdom



"Alberta life science and ICT companies are increasingly looking at the U.K. as an entry point into the European market."

Murray Sigler, Alberta UK Office According to the International Monetary Fund, "...growth in the United Kingdom slowed to 1.8% in 2005, driven by a slowdown in consumption in response to the cooling of the housing market, earlier monetary policy tightening, and higher energy prices". Despite the weaker economic expansion in 2005, the U.K. has outperformed most major European economies over the past five years.

In 2005, Alberta exports to the U.K. fell by 3.0% from last year, to \$208 million. The U.K. accounted for 16.9% of Alberta's exports to Europe in 2005, while Alberta's share of Canadian exports to the U.K. was 2.8%.

Alberta's top exports to the U.K., nickel and wheat (non-durum), accounted for one-third of exports. Nickel shipments fell by 22.4% to \$52 million, while wheat deliveries increased by 22.0% to \$27 million.

Manufactured goods accounted for 82.7% of Alberta exports to the U.K.. In 2005, manufacturing exports decreased by 6.5%.

Germany



"...recent forecasts seem to confirm that Germany is enjoying a long-sought economic recovery in 2006".

Reg Kontz, Alberta Germany Office Germany is the largest economy in Europe. In 2005, Germany's real GDP grew by 1.0%, down from the 1.6% advance registered in 2004. Over the past five years, it has been one of the slowest growing European economies. The modernization and integration of eastern Germany, labour market rigidities and high unemployment continue to hinder economic growth.

Alberta exported \$111 million worth of goods to Germany in 2005, up 23.4% from 2004. This was the first year-over-year increase in exports since 2000. The majority of Alberta exports to Germany were manufactured goods (92.9%). Manufacturing exports jumped by 41.3% due to sharply higher deliveries of *chemicals.* Heterocyclic compound sales increased from \$1.3 million in 2004 to \$26 million in 2005, while woodpulp deliveries rose by \$2.2 million to \$25 million.

Germany accounted for 9.0% of Alberta's exports to Europe, and Alberta's share of Canadian exports was 3.8%.

Middle East & North Africa

The Middle East and North Africa (MENA) is an economically diverse region that includes both the oil-rich economies in the Gulf and countries that are resource-scarce, such as Egypt, Morocco, and Yemen.

Oil and gas field equipment dominates exports The MENA economy grew strongly by 5.0% in 2005, similar to the growth rate achieved in the previous year. The economies of oil exporting nations, such as Iran, the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and Saudi Arabia, grew by about 6.2% because of higher export earnings due to strong energy prices and increased domestic demand. Growth in non-oil exporting countries (up 4.3%) in the region benefited from the spin-offs from the oil exporting nations.


MENA was Alberta's fourth largest trading region, but only represented 0.6% of Alberta's exports. In 2005, Alberta exports to MENA climbed by 11.3% from 2004, to \$491 million. Large export increases were noted for boring machinery and drilling derricks, barley, and distilling and rectifying machinery. Lower sales were noted for wheat and durum wheat, compressors, prefabricated buildings, and drilling machinery parts. Alberta's top exports to the region included wheat and durum wheat, barley and drilling equipment.

Alberta's Exports to Middle East & North Africa

In 2005, exports to:

- Iran more than tripled to \$81 million because of sharp increases in distilling and rectifying plant machinery, and barley deliveries;
- the UAE fell by 13.6% due to lower wheat and drilling equipment parts;
- Algeria declined by 10.4% as a large drop in wheat exports more than offset a large gain in drilling equipment;
- Saudi Arabia rose by 11.6% due to an increase in computer equipment; and
- Kuwait almost tripled because of increased sales of mobile drilling derricks, and boring and sinking machinery.



South America

South American imports from Alberta decline in 2005 The South American economy grew by a healthy 4.7% in 2005. Strong global demand for metals and fuels in the Andean region (Colombia, Ecuador, Peru and Venezuela) and for agricultural products in Argentina and Uruguay fuelled this growth. Very strong economic growth was noted for Argentina (up 9.2%), Chile (up 6.3%), Uruguay (up 6.0%), Peru (up 6.7%) and Venezuela (up 9.3%).


South America imported 3.2% less from Alberta in 2005 than in 2004. Lower imports of wheat, machinery for liquefying gas, and sulphur were noted. South America bought more heavy fuel oils (such as diesel), drilling machinery parts, malt and coal. Wheat (including durum), sulphur and refined petroleum products were the region's top imports.

Alberta's Exports to South America

Shipments to Venezuela and Colombia decreased by 6.0% and 31.7%, respectively, due to lower wheat shipments. Lower sulphur and machinery for liquefying gas deliveries caused a 33.8% decline in Brazilian imports. Chilean imports grew by 34.2% on higher sulphur and coal sales, and Peruvian imports rose by 115.2% on higher petroleum product deliveries

In 2005, imports by South America totalled \$334 million. This represented 0.4% of Alberta exports. On a national basis, Alberta accounted for 11.3% of Canada's exports to South America.



Alberta's Exports to South America Total: \$334 Million


Oceania

Exports to Oceania set new record in 2005 Oceania consists of Australia, New Zealand and other South Pacific countries. Australia and New Zealand account for nearly all of the regions economic activity. Economic growth in Australia slowed from 3.6% in 2004 to 2.5% in 2005 due to lower domestic demand that weakened in the face of a cooling housing market and rising energy costs. Over the same period, economic growth in New Zealand slowed from 4.4% to 2.2%. Exchange rate appreciation hurt net exports for both countries.

Oceania's imports from Alberta were up 15.7% from 2004, to \$192 million – the highest level on record. Australia and New Zealand dominate this region, capturing 97.7% of Oceania's imports from Alberta. Imports by Australia grew by 9.0%, while New Zealand's climbed by 48.6%. Alberta has seen its shipments to Oceania trend upward since 2001. In 2005, Alberta captured 10.5% of Canadian exports to the region.

Australia accounted for 72.9% of Alberta's exports to Oceania in 2005, with most of the remainder going to New Zealand. Large export gains to Oceania were noted for sulphur (up from \$2.4 million to \$37.4 million) and pork. Imports of ethylene polymers slipped from \$30.0 million in 2004 to \$12.7 million in 2005.

Alberta's Exports to Oceania

Central America

Refined petroleum product exports sharply higher Central America is located between the southern border of Mexico and the northwest border of Colombia and includes the Caribbean island nations. GDP grew by 5.9% in the Caribbean island nations primarily due to increases in tourism and construction activity, while the remaining Central American countries grew by 3.8% largely due to higher exports.

In 2005, Alberta exports to Central America increased by 4.7% to \$179 million. Sales to Cuba and Guatemala increased by 24.5% and 16.3%, respectively. These two countries represented nearly two-thirds of exports to the region.


The three largest merchandise exports (refined petroleum products, wheat and sulphur) accounted for more than half of the sales to the region. Deliveries of refined petroleum products (e.g. fuel oils) more than quadrupled to \$43 million in 2005 and were almost entirely destined to Guatemala. Wheat sales declined due to lower deliveries to Cuba, Jamaica and Guatemala. Sulphur sales were lower because of fewer deliveries to Cuba in 2005.

Exports to Central America accounted for 0.2% of Alberta's exports, and for 13.8% of Canada's exports to the area.

Commonwealth of Independent States

Russia remains the largest export market in the CIS The Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) consists of 12 of the 15 former Soviet Republics (the exceptions being Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania). The economies of this vast region expanded by approximately 6.5% in 2005. Russia, the largest economy in the CIS, grew by 6.4%. Energy exporting countries in the region grew by 7.1%, offsetting lower growth in the rest of the CIS (up 4.2%) due to weak growth in the Ukraine and declining output in Kyrgyzstan.

Alberta's top exports to the region were related to oil and gas field parts and equipment. Sales of distilling and rectifying plants, dryers, and compressors and pumps increased. At the same time, deliveries of filtering and purifying machinery for liquids, and boring and sinking machinery parts were lower.

In 2005, Alberta exports to the CIS region grew by 23.9% from 2004, to \$176 million. Russia accounted for more than one half of exports to the CIS. Alberta accounted for approximately 23.2% of Canada CIS trade. The CIS represented 0.2% of the Alberta's total exports.

Exports to Russia (up 18.7%) and Turkmenistan (up 84.2%) rose because of higher oil & gas field parts and machinery sales. Over the same period, however, Kazakhstan deliveries declined by 5.2% on weaker energy patch sales.

Sub-Saharan Africa

Grain shipments remain Sub-Saharan Africa's top import The Sub-Saharan Africa region includes the African countries that do not border the Mediterranean Sea. In 2005, the region's economy grew by about 5.5%. Economic activity grew approximately by 7.0% in oil exporting countries, while the advance in GDP in the rest of Sub-Saharan Africa was close to 4.4%.

Alberta's exports to Sub-Saharan Africa jumped by 18.9% to \$157 million. Sub-Saharan Africa represented only 0.2% of Alberta's total exports. Alberta's share of Canadian merchandise exports to the region in 2005 was 14.6%.

The largest export to the region was wheat, accounting for 31% of exports, followed by sulphur and lifting & handling machinery. In 2005, wheat shipments decreased by 3.8% from 2004, to \$49 million.

Exports to South Africa, Sudan and Nigeria represented 72.2% of exports to Sub-Saharan Africa. Exports to Sudan increased strongly by 81.1% to \$55 million due to higher deliveries of oil and gas field equipment. South African imports were up 30.4% because of higher sulphur sales.
